Having also captured the MACJC North Division men's basketball regular-season championship for the first time since the 2012-13 season, the Lions ended their 2018-19 season with a 19-8 overall record and 10-2 division mark after dropping a 72-64 quarterfinal-round decision to Holmes during the NJCAA Region 23 Tournament played on the Mississippi College campus in Clinton.
- b. EMCC will hold men's basketball tryouts on Saturday, April 6, on the Scooba campus.
- c. Sophomores Malik Harper and Noel Jones are set to represent the EMCC Lions in the MACJC All-Star Men's Basketball All-Star Game, which will be played April 12 in Brackeen-Wood Gymnasium on the East Central campus in Decatur.

3. Women's Basketball

- a. Coach Sharon Thompson's Lady Lions finished the 2018-19 basketball season with an 11-13 overall and an 8-4 MACJC North Division mark. As the No. 3 seed in the MACJC North, the EMCC women closed the campaign with a 65-47 setback to Copiah-Lincoln in the quarterfinals of the MACJC State Basketball Tournament played at Jones College in Ellisville.
- b. Sophomore Brianna Page is set to represent the EMCC Lady Lions in the MACJC All-Star Women's Basketball All-Star Game, which will be played April 12 in Brackeen-Wood Gymnasium on the East Central campus in Decatur.

4. Baseball

a. Coach Brett Kimbrel's EMCC baseball team, 3-14 overall and 0-4 in MACJC play, will close out the month of March by playing host to Northwest Mississippi on the 27th and then hitting the road to play East Central on the 30th in Decatur. The Lions will open April on the road at Mississippi Delta (April 2) before playing four consecutive conference doubleheaders on the Scooba campus – April 6 vs. Hinds, April 10 vs. Holmes, April 13 vs. Pearl River & April 16 vs. Coahoma.
