(iv) The balance of Road Project construction costs not funded pursuant to Sections 5(a)(i)-(iii) above will be equally divided between the County and City and contributed from the general fund or special road fund of each, as appropriate.

#### c) Construction.

- (i) As lead agency, the County will be solely responsible for the finalization of plans and specifications and the approval, advertisement, acceptance of bids, execution of construction contracts, oversight of construction, and payments to the contractor in accord with statutory and other requirements for the use and expenditure of public funds.
- (ii) The County will keep the City reasonably informed of the activities set forth in subsection 5(c)(i) above.
- (iii) In the event the construction bids exceed the estimate of \$997,000, the County and City will confer and agree on the action to take, such as cost reductions through modification of Road Project scope, to bidding or acceptance of a bid which exceeds the estimate, all in accord with statutory requirements. The County shall not accept a bid in excess of the estimate without the prior written consent of the City.

#### d) Accounting Payments and Approvals.

- (i) Prior to the construction contract award, the County will provide details of the construction contract(s), including construction costs and the timetable of construction payments.
- (ii) At the time of construction contract award, the County and City will establish a formula, approved by the Board of Supervisors and Board of Mayor and Selectmen, approving the contract and establishing a formula and timetable for the payment of project costs by the County and City.
- (iii) Upon receipt of payment requests from the contractor, the County Engineer will promptly review the same, determine whether each is proper and payable, and, upon approval by the County, transmit a copy of the same to the City together with an itemized invoice documenting the City's share of the payment to the contractor. Any payments to be made from the City general fund, as provided

## National Dislocated Worker Grant COVID-19

#### What is the National Dislocated Worker Grant (NDWG) COVID-19 program?

- Provides disaster-relief assistance employment, including the salary, fringe (includes FICA and Social Security taxes), and worker's comp for participants
- Each county may have 3 participants who can work up to 320 hours (no overtime work is allowed)
- Participants may be paid up to \$15 per hour
- ALL INDIVIDUALS MUST BE APPROVED BY THREE RIVERS PDD BEFORE BEING ALLOWED TO WORK IN THE COVID-19 PROGRAM.

#### What should a county do to become approved for the NDWG COVID-19 program?

- Complete the Worksite Agreement that is attached and return to Terry Treadaway (ttreadawy@trpdd.com) at Three Rivers PDD.
- Provide a job title, job description, and rate of pay for each job

#### Who is eligible to be hired for the NDWG COVID-19 program?

- To be eligible individuals must be fall in one of the following 4 categories:
  - 1. Is temporarily or permanently laid off as a consequence of the COVID-19 pandemic
  - 2. Is an eligible dislocated workers as defined in WIOA Section 3(15)
  - 3. Is long-term unemployed workers, as defined by one of the following:
    - Unemployed for more than 26 weeks
    - Unable to secure employment due to the general economic condition in the community in which the individual resides as a result of the disaster
  - 4. Self-employed individuals who become unemployed or significantly underemployed as a result of the emergency or disaster.
- Individuals will have to complete enrollment paperwork at a local WIN Job Center as well as an application
  with Qualified Staffing, the temp agency who will be paying the individual.
- Individuals will be required to pass a drug test prior to being eligible to work.
- Counties who want to refer someone for a job through the COVID-19 program should email Terry
  Treadaway the individuals name and phone number so Three Rivers PDD can contact the person to
  determine eligibility.
- ALL INDIVIDUALS MUST BE APPROVED BY THREE RIVERS PDD BEFORE BEING ALLOWED TO WORK IN THE COVID-19 PROGRAM.

  - . `a. Notify the Gateway Workforce Services Provider if an intern quits, fails to report to work for two consecutive days, or has excessive unexcused absences from work.
    - b. Notify the Gateway Workforce Services Provider if a problem arises with an intern so that the problem may be solved or the intern removed from the worksite.
    - c. Have a sign-out procedure at the Worksite Agency's main office if the intern will be working in different Worksite Agency locations.
    - d. Provide supervision by a competent adult that will not exceed a 1:5 supervisor to Gateway Intern ratio.
    - e. Complete timesheets for each intern and submit it to the Gateway Workforce Services Provider.
  - f. Notify the Gateway Workforce Services Provider of any written or oral complaint relating to the conditions of this agreement and will assist in any investigation undertaken, whether by the Mississippi Department of Employment Security, the Mississippi Partnership Local Workforce Development Area, or the Mississippi Department of Human Services to ascertain facts relevant to the complaint.

#### Section III. Effective Date

This Worksite Employer and the Gateway Workforce Service Providers will adhere to the above criteria and all guidelines of the Rules and Regulations governing the internship program. This agreement shall become effective when signed by the Worksite Agency and Gateway Services Provider and shall remain in effect June 30, 2020, unless terminated by one of the two parties.







#### The State of Mental Health from a Community-Based Perspective

Region VII Mental Health / Intellectual Disabilities Commission has been in existence for over 40 years. In that time, we have seen funding go from Community Mental Health Block Grant (MHBG), to Medicaid fee-for-service (FFS), to managed care organizations (MCO's). With each addition, replacement or supposed improvement in the payor sources, service cuts followed. Currently, the MCO's are increasing their profits by reducing the services the mentally ill population receives. This results in an improved monetary incentive for the multi-billion-dollar MCO's to continue in Mississippi. Meanwhile, the sickest of the sick are denied services.

Twenty-four percent (24%), or approximately 696,000 individuals of Mississippi's population are covered by the Medicaid/CHIP program. (Kalser Foundation, October, 2019) Of that number, the fourteen (14) Community Mental Health Centers (CMHC's) treat mental Illness, serious emotional disturbances, intellectual and developmental disabilities and substance use in approximately 115,000 men, women and children in Mississippi each year, or approximately 4% of the total population of the state. However, funding and access to care continue to be impeded by the MCO's and DMH.

In order for Mississippi to move forward in the treatment of mental illness, we need new leadership. DMH has been incapable of making the tough decisions and implementing needed changes as first identified by the 2008 legislative PEER report on Mental Health and confirmed by the findings outlined in the Department of Justice (DOJ) lawsuit. In order to comply with Judge Reeves' order, funding must be shifted from DMH to community-based services, MCO's must be held accountable to improve quality of care and access to needed services, beds must be reduced at the six state hospitals or some closed entirely, and only the forensic or sickest of the sick be housed at a state hospital. This must happen to bring MS's fractured mental health system into the 21st century.







#### Who is eligible to be hired for the NDWG COVID-19 program?

- To be eligible individuals must be fall in one of the following 4 categories:
  - 1. Is temporarily or permanently laid off as a consequence of the COVID-19 pandemic 2. Is an eligible dislocated workers as defined in WIOA Section 3(15)
    - 3. Is long-term unemployed workers, as defined by one of the following:
      - Unemployed for more than 26 weeks
      - Unable to secure employment due to the general economic condition in the community in which the individual resides as a result of the disaster
    - 4. Self-employed individuals who become unemployed or significantly underemployed as a result of the emergency or disaster.
- Individuals will have to complete enrollment paperwork at a local WIN Job Center as well as an application with Qualified Staffing, the temp agency who will be paying the individual.
- Individuals will be required to pass a drug test prior to being eligible to work.
- Counties who want to refer someone for a job through the COVID-19 program should email Terry

- 3. The Worksite Agency agrees to:
  - 'a. Notify the Gateway Workforce Services Provider if an intern quits, fails to report to work for two consecutive days, or has excessive unexcused absences from work.
  - b. Notify the Gateway Workforce Services Provider if a problem arises with an intern so that the problem may be solved or the intern removed from the worksite.
  - c. Have a sign-out procedure at the Worksite Agency's main office if the intern will be working in different Worksite Agency locations.
  - d. Provide supervision by a competent adult that will not exceed a 1:5 supervisor to Gateway Intern ratio.
  - e. Complete timesheets for each intern and submit it to the Gateway Workforce Services Provider.
  - f. Notify the Gateway Workforce Services Provider of any written or oral complaint relating to the conditions of this agreement and will assist in any investigation undertaken, whether by the Mississippi Department of Employment Security, the Mississippi Partnership Local Workforce Development Area, or the Mississippi Department of Human Services to ascertain facts relevant to the complaint.
- 4. The Worksite Agency understands that:
  - a. Hours each intern may work will be negotiated between the Worksite Agency and the Gateway Workforce Services Providers. If the intern is permitted to work beyond the negotiated limit, the wages for hours worked in excess of the limit will become the responsibility of the worksite agency.
  - b. Three Rivers Planning & Development District and/or other state or federal representatives may monitor the worksite to ensure that both the Gateway Workforce Services Provider and the worksite agency are in compliance with this agreement.

#### Section II. Regulations for the Gateway Workforce Services Provider

- 1. The Gateway Workforce Services Provider will provide forms to be used to record time and attendance, which must be signed by the intern and Worksite Agency and submitted to the Gateway Workforce Services Provider.
- 2. The Gateway Workforce Services Provider, in conjunction with the Worksite Agency, will determine the number of hours the intern may work and the intern's pay rate.
- 3. The Gateway Workforce Services Providers will maintain Worker's Compensation Insurance for work related accidents. Each Gateway Services Provider will provide the Worksite Agency information regarding procedures for work related accidents and Worker's Compensation
- 4. The Gateway Workforce Services Providers will monitor all job site(s) in conjunction with the Mississippi Partnership Local Workforce Development Area's requirements in order to ensure compliance with this agreement.

#### Section III. Effective Date

This Worksite Employer and the Gateway Workforce Service Providers will adhere to the above criteria and all guidelines of the Rules and Regulations governing the internship program. This agreement shall become effective when signed by the Worksite Agency and Gateway Services Provider and shall remain in effect June 30, 2020, unless terminated by one of the two parties.



#### RE: RESOLUTION DECLARING LOCAL DISASTER, ETC.

WHEREAS, Section 19-11-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, provides that:

Upon the happening of any emergency caused by fire, flood, storm, epidemic, riot or insurrection, or caused by an inherent defect due to defective construction, or when the immediate preservation of order or of public health is necessary, or when the restoration of a condition of usefulness of any public building or other property which has been destroyed by accident or otherwise, is necessary, or when mandatory expenditures required by law must be met, the board of supervisors may, upon adoption, by unanimous vote of all members present at any meeting, of a resolution stating the facts constituting the emergency and entering the same on its minutes, make the expenditures, borrow money or incur the liabilities necessary \*\*\*, and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services Secretary Alex Azar declared a public health emergency for COVID-19 beginning on January 27, 2020; on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization characterized COVID-19 as a pandemic, and on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared a nationwide state of emergency due to the coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on March 14, 2020, pursuant to the Constitution of the State of Mississippi and Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 33-15-1 1(b)(17), Governor Tate Roeves issued a Proclamation declaring that a State of Emergency exists in the State of Mississippi as a result of the outbreak of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the worldwide outbreak of COVID-19 and the effects of its extreme risk of person-to-person transmission finoughout the United States and the State of Mississippi significantly impact the life and health of our people, as well as the economy of Clay County and the State of Mississippi; and

Publish March 2922 April 5, 2020

- v. Any future recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) or the Mississippi State Department of Health for responding to COVID-19 shall modify this resolution to the extent recommended without further action on the part of this Board of Supervisors.
- w. Signs at the entrances of all public buildings and workplaces shall be posted to be in words and figures as shown by Exhibit "A", as if fully copied at this point.
- x. A copy of this resolution shall be delivered to each Department Head.
- y. This resolution shall take effective immediately and remain effective until further notice.
- z. This resolution shall be published in *The Daily Times Leader*, a newspaper having general circulation in Clay County, Mississippi, as provided by statute and posted the website for the County.

- n. Department Heads shall place posters that encourage staying home when sick, cough and sneeze etiquette, and hand hygiene at the entrance to the workplace and in other workplace areas where they are likely to be seen.
- o. Department Heads shall provide tissues and no-touch disposal receptacles for use by employees.
- p. Department Heads shall instruct employees to clean their hands often with an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60-95% alcohol, or wash their hands with soap and water for at least twenty (20) seconds. Soap and water should be used preferentially if hands are visibly dirty.
- q. Department Heads are encouraged to visit the coughing and sneezing ctiquette and clean hands section of the Mississippi State Board of Health web-page for more information.
- r. Employees are encouraged to routinely clean all frequently touched surfaces in the workplace, such as workstations, counter-tops, and doorknobs. Use the cleaning agents that are usually used in these areas and follow the directions on the label.
- s. Traveling by employees is not advised or recommended until further notice unless reasonably necessary. Employees are advised that before traveling outside the County to take certain steps:
  - Check the CDC's Traveler's Health Notices for the latest guidance and recommendations for each country to which you will travel. Specific travel information for travelers going to and returning from China, and information for aircrew, can be found on the CDC website.

function, employment or title. This paragraph shall not apply to essential services, such as grocery stores, gas stations, health car facilities, nursing homes, drug stores, banks, convenience stores, or other businesses designated as a critical infrastructure industry.

- b. The entrances to all County Courthouses (Circuit, Chancery and Justice Court) shall be attended by a law enforcement officer or security personnel as designated by the Clay County Sheriff, who shall be authorized to inquire about the nature of business for which the person seeks to enter said facility and to the extent necessary facilitate the transfer of documents to the requested office or recommend the person contact the office for assistance by telephone, if the person is visibly ill.
- c. Until further notice, no building owned by Clay County, Mississippi, shall be made available for rent by the general public regardless of the stated or intended purpose of such rental.
- d. The Sheriff of Clay County is authorized and directed to institute visitation policies for the Clay County Jail so as to minimize and prevent the spread of COVID-19 and other infectious diseases, except visitation with prisoners by their attorney shall not be unreasonably restricted.
- e. The Janitorial Staff should clean and sanitize offices more often until further notice and the Staff is encouraged to utilize trusties as identified by the Sheriff of Clay County.
- f. Employees are encouraged to wash their hands often, practice social distancing (maintaining a distance of at least six (6) feet), use hand sanitizer and clean their work stations more often until further notice.
- g. Department Heads are encouraged to adjust high-risk employees so they do not interact with the public.
- h. Sick employees are encouraged to stay home.

WHEREAS, the risk of spread of COVID-19 within Clay County, Mississippi constitutes a public emergency that may result in substantial injury or harm to life, health, and property within Clay County, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the Mississippi State Department of Health confirmed the first presumptive case of COVID-19 in Mississippi and as of March 19, 2020, there are 140 presumptive and confirmed cases in Mississippi that have tested positive for COVID-19, which includes 1 case in Clay County; and

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidance for responding to COVID-19 suggests avoiding crowds as much as possible, especially for older adults and individuals with serious chronic medical conditions, and the Mississippi State Department of Health has recommended avoiding large gatherings of more than 10 people; and

WHEREAS, Mississippi state agencies and governmental entities as well as school districts that have temporarily closed or are operating on limited staffing in response to COVID-19 in order to minimize the interaction and risk of possible transmission of COVID-19 between employees within governmental offices and between governmental employees and members of the public will need flexibility to meet continuity of essential operations and to address the economic impact on employees who may be asked not to report to work if their duties are not deemed essential during any period of time during the State of Emergency; and

WHEREAS, the hereinabove stated facts constitute a local emergency within the meaning of Section 19-11-21, *Mississippi Code of 1972*, *Annotated*, caused by epidemic and the immediate preservation of public health is necessary.

#### IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED AND RESOLVED:

1. That due to the State of Emergency and pursuant to Section 19-11-21 and Section 33-15-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated, all Department Heads are directed to promptly review and identify which employees perform essential duties to carry out the entity's core functions during the State of Emergency and those employees whose duties are deemed non-essential during any period of time during the State of Emergency. And where feasible, as determined by the Department Heads, if core functions and duties could be performed by essential employees from home in order to minimize the interaction and risk of possible

such as healthcare facilities or clinics, nursing homes, pharmacies, grocery stores, gas stations, banks, food marts, convenience stores, discount or dollar stores, child care facilities, laundry mats, and manufacturers located in commercial or industrial districts.

- Section 2. Effective immediately, and continuing until further action by the Clay County Board of Supervisors, all restaurants, in addition to the ten (10) person limit as provided herein, are encouraged to serve food using drive-through, pick-up, to include curbaide pick-up, or delivery methods.
- Section 3. Effective immediately, and continuing until further action by the Clay County Board of Supervisors, all churches, temples and places of worship, assemblages and gatherings within the boundaries of Clay County shall adhere to the guidelines of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Mississippl State Department of Health and limit crowds, assemblages or gatherings to no more than ten (10) people. Such entities and assemblages and gatherings are reminded and encouraged to use live-streaming services or other electronic means of broadcasting or recording.
- Section 4. Reflective immediately, and continuing until further action by the Clay County Board of Supervisors, all businesses, agencies, manufacturers and units of government located within Clay County employing ten (10) or more employees in any one business shall take all reasonable measures to ensure that such businesses comply with CDC recommendations and guidance and implement appropriate safeguards to prevent the spread of infectious disease, including but not limited to: mandating social distancing, sending home and actively encouraging sick employees to stay home and sending home employees who appear to have respiratory illness symptoms, emphasizing work-from-home where possible, mandating respiratory etiquetic and proper hand hygiene, maintaining clean and sanitary workplaces, cautioning employees regarding travel and taking all such additional measures to prohibit and/or reduce the spread of infectious disease, especially COVID-19.
- Section 5. Violation of any provisions herein shall be punished by a fine not exceeding One Thousand Dollars, (\$1,000.00) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days, and cost of prosecution, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the justice court judge, except as provided otherwise by state law. Each violation is a separate offense.
- Section 6. The County may issue such orders as are necessary for the production of life and liberty.
- Section 7. This resolution shall take effective immediately and shall remain effective until further notice. The previously adopted resolution of the Clay County Board of Supervisors shall remain in full force and effect, except to the extent modified herein.

Section 8. This resolution shall be published in *The Daily Times Leader*, a newspaper having general circulation in Clay County, Mississippi, as provided by statute and posted on the website for the County.
