Supervisor Davis moved to authorize and approve to award and accept the lease purchase financing bid for the purchase of the 2021 Garbage Refuse Truck, 25 cubic yards, to Bank of Commerce for a 36-month lease at a rate of 1.490% with a monthly payment of \$2,498.46, upon the maturity of the three-year lease, the payoff will be \$116,352

AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE TO RESCIND THE VOTE TO ENTER INTO LEASE PURCHASE FINANCING WITH BANKFIRST BANK FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE SHERIFF VEHICLES AND TO AWARD THE LEASE PURCHASE FINANCING BID TO BANK OF COMMERCE FOR THE SAID FINANCING

It appears to this Board, at the September 9, 2021 meeting, this Board awarded and accepted the bid for the lease purchase financing for a portion of the purchase price of the Sheriff Vehicles to BankFirst Bank. At closing, the Clerk was informed by BankFirst the only acceptable form of payment for the monthly payment was ACH Draft. Pursuant to *Mississippi Code*, Counties are required to issue a County Warrant for the payment of each claim as presented and approved by the Board of Supervisors. Due to not accepting a check for the monthly lease purchase payment, the Clerk contacted the second-best bid accepted on September 9, 2021 being that of Bank of Commerce Bank, to see if they would still honor their bid. Bank of Commerce agreed to honor the said bid for 60 months, at a rate of 1.49%, monthly payment of \$5,591.40.

Supervisor Davis moved to authorize and approve to rescind the vote to enter into lease purchase financing with BankFirst Bank and approves to accept and award the bid for the lease purchase financing for a portion of the purchase of the Sheriff Vehicles to Bank of Commerce Bank.

The motion was seconded by Supervisor Horton.

AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE THE EMERGENCY PURCHASE OF A TRANSMISSION FOR THE 2017 DODGE SANITATION TRUCK FROM PERFORMANCE AUTOMOTIVES INC IN THE AMOUNT OF \$6,989.97

It appears to this Board a transmission is needed for the 2017 Dodge Truck used by the Sanitation Department every day for the pickup of trash in the County. Additionally, without the use of the truck, trash will not get picked-up and this would have a negative impact on the daily operations of the Sanitation Department, as well as, a negative impact to the public health of the citizens of Clay County. Performance Automotives Inc is the only vendor the purchase clerk has found that has the said replacement part in stock. All the other vendors checked, did not have the replacement part in stock and was unable to

submit a quote due to not knowing when the said item could be delivered and would be in stock.

Supervisor Davis moved to authorize and approve the Emergency Purchase of the transmission in the amount of \$6,989.97 from Performance Automotives Inc in order for the 2017 Dodge Truck to operate and assist in the daily pick up of trash in the County.

The motion was seconded by Supervisor Chandler.

**KNOWLEDGE OF FEDERAL AND STATE LAWS CONCERNING BID PROCEDURES AND
CONTRACTS**

Calvert-Spradling Engineers has focused on assisting clients in securing Federal and State loans and grants. This focus includes communication with the Federal and State Agency staff and the project administrator's staff in details to assure compliance with the rules for bidding procedures and contract compliance.

The CDBG and LPA programs assign the responsibility of the Professional Engineer assisting in the application preparation to plan and develop a project scope that adheres to the program guidelines. The objective of these Programs are to benefit low-and moderate-income persons. Low-and moderate-income is an income that is at or below eighty (80) percent of the county's median household income in which the person or family resides. The low-and moderate-income benefit is the primary national objective and assisted activities must benefit low-and moderate- income persons under one of the four categories. The categories include area benefit activities, limited clientele activities, low and moderate income housing activities, and low-and moderate- income job creation/retention activities.

Federal and State procurement procedures are required in the selection of engineering services. All procurement transactions must be conducted in a manner providing full and open completion. The Applicant for grant funds must advertise for an engineer/architect and identify the project engineer/architect of record to provide cost estimates and project engineering services prior to submitting an application for funding.

Calvert-Spradling Engineers will develop an Engineering Report and prepare cost estimates that show documentation of the project scope and justification for the proposed design. The scope of the proposed project adheres to the Federal and State program guidelines and meets the need of the Applicant. This requires the Engineer to work closely with the Applicant, project administrator, and the Federal and State agencies.

The Engineer's data must clearly identify: (1) the area benefiting from the improvements, (2) the needs which are being addressed, (3) the nature and scope of the improvements, (4) justification for proposed design, (5) a detailed opinion of probable costs, and (6) timetable for implementation. Maps must clearly identify the area benefiting from the proposed improvements and define the scope and layout of the proposed improvements, existing system layout and the connection thereto.

The Engineer shall certify that they have reviewed the applicable State and Federal Engineering Guidelines and that the engineering data provided in the application was developed in accordance therewith. The Engineer's opinion of probable cost shall be signed and sealed by an engineer licensed to practice engineering in the State of Mississippi.

Engineering fees are defined by three categories: Basic Design services, Basic Inspection services, and Additional services. Basic Design services include those services typically required to complete planning, conceptual design, preliminary and final design, development of construction plans and contract documents, and coordinating the advertisement, bidding, bid evaluation and recommendation of award of the project. Basic Inspection services include those services required for inspection, as well as construction administration services including interpretation of plans, processing pay requests and final inspection and project close-out. Construction work shall be inspected at intervals which the Engineer deems necessary to verify that the project is constructed in accordance with the design. Additional services include those items which may be required but not considered basic engineering services. These services are project specific. Examples of typical additional services are geotechnical investigation, testing of materials, permitting, wetland delineation and mitigation, endangered species identification, cultural resources surveys, land surveying, and right of way easements.
