

Dear Mr Davis

The Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) has reviewed Mr Harmon Robinson's request on behalf of the Clay County Board of Supervisors for emergency authorization to operate a temporary vegetative debris burn site for storm debris generated in recent severe weather events in Clay County. The request describes the location of the site as in the SW¼, Section 16, Township 20N, Range 13E, just off Pheba-Beasley Road. Based on our assessment of the information provided and the conditions in Clay County, the MDEQ recognizes that there is an emergency need for this burn site for the management of vegetative debris resulting from the storm. Consequently, pursuant to Section II O of the Mississippi Nonhazardous Solid Waste Management Regulations and the MDEQ Emergency Debris Management Guidance dated April 29, 2011, MDEQ hereby grants emergency authorization to the Clay County Board of Supervisors and its agent working as contractor to operate the site. The County and its agent working as contractor shall ensure that the site is operated and closed in a manner that complies with the aforementioned guidance and with the following operating conditions:

1. The emergency vegetative debris burn site may accept natural vegetative debris generated as a result of the April 27, 2011 tornado event, unless otherwise authorized by the MDEQ. Vegetative debris includes downed trees, limbs, stumps, leaves and other natural vegetation generated as a result of the storm, but does not include dimensional lumber or similar wooden construction materials.
2. A separation distance of at least 250 feet shall be maintained between the burn area and the nearest property line, unless otherwise approved by MDEQ.
3. A separation distance of at least 250 feet shall be maintained between the burn area and the nearest state water body (e.g. lakes, rivers, creeks, streams, etc.), unless otherwise approved by MDEQ.

- 4 A separation distance of at least 1500 feet shall be maintained between the burn area and the any occupied dwelling or commercial or private airport property, unless otherwise approved by MDEQ
- 5 An appropriate separation distance shall be maintained between the burn area and other surrounding brush, forested areas, structures and other non-vegetative debris piles, in order to minimize the chances of a surrounding fire being caused by the open burning authorized by this letter
- 6 A site attendant shall be on duty at all times that open burning is being conducted. Appropriate fire extinguishing equipment shall also be readily accessible during burning operations
- 7 The site operator may use only fossil fuels (e.g. diesel, kerosene, etc) to ignite the fire. No synthetic materials such as tires, asphalt shingles, plastics and other similar materials may be used as starter fuels
- 8 Adequate security and monitoring shall be established and maintained at the site to prevent uncontrolled access and disposal
- 9 Incoming waste loads containing building debris, household wastes, other non-vegetative debris and any other storm wastes shall not be unloaded at the site. Loads containing these wastes should be directed to an appropriate disposal facility. Any such unauthorized waste materials inadvertently placed and found at this site shall be separated and temporarily stored away from the vegetative debris burn area for removal to an appropriate permitted disposal facility. It is the responsibility of the site operator to remove and properly dispose of any such unauthorized and non-vegetative wastes
- 10 The local fire department shall be notified upon commencement of debris burning activities. The local government or fire department may employ other limitations where determined necessary
- 11 Should off-site nuisance conditions affecting air quality develop from the operation of this burn site, MDEQ may require additional control equipment to be employed or other preventive or corrective actions, including the use of forced-draft air systems
- 12 The site operator shall implement storm water controls at the site that address the following
 - a. Storm water and other waters upslope from the active burning areas and the debris/ash storage areas shall be diverted around these affected areas to prevent run-on into the storage areas
 - b. The operator is encouraged to minimize the amount of surface area of the debris and ash pile(s) that is exposed to rainfall to the extent possible
 - c. Best management practices (BMP's) should be implemented around the debris and ash piles to limit impacts from storm water runoff from the exposed piles. These BMP's may include preservation of existing vegetation or the employment of straw bale dikes, silt fences, earthen dikes, drainage swales, sediment traps, and temporary sediment basins
 - d. Storm water flow from the site shall be free from debris and other floating or suspended materials

- e The operator is encouraged to implement provisions that would minimize off-site vehicle tracking of debris, ash or other sediments
 - f The operator shall conduct storm water inspections routinely of the property and of the periphery of the property and shall repair, replace or supplement storm water controls as necessary within 24 hours of discovery
- 13 Written notice shall be furnished by Clay County to the MDEQ upon completion of burning operations
- 14 All operations at this site, including site closure and restoration, shall be completed by October 31, 2011. Closure and restoration activities shall include the following
- a. The removal of all unburned vegetative debris and any other non-vegetative debris staged at the site. These wastes shall either be disposed of at a permitted solid waste management facility or recycled at a legitimate recycling facility
 - b All remaining ash and combustion residuals should be removed and disposed of in a manner approved by MDEQ

Should additional time be necessary to complete the closure and restoration activities, the County should contact MDEQ to request an extension

Clay County and its agents working as contractors are responsible for maintaining compliance with the operating and closure requirements, as outlined above. The MDEQ reserves the right to inspect the burning operations at all reasonable times. Furthermore, should the County fail to adhere to the restrictions outlined above or other related solid waste laws, regulations or ordinances, additional operating conditions may be required or the emergency burning authorization may be terminated by the MDEQ. The request describes the location of the site as in the SE 1/4 Section 10 Township 16S, Range 4E on Enon Road and owned by Mr. David Waide. Based on our assessment of the information provided and the conditions in Clay County, the MDEQ recognizes that there is an emergency need for this burn site for the management of vegetative debris resulting from the storm. Consequently, MDEQ hereby grants emergency authorization to Clay County in accordance with the MDEQ Emergency Debris Management Guidance dated April 29, 2011, and Section II O of the Mississippi Nonhazardous Solid Waste Management Regulations. The County shall ensure that the site is operated and closed in a manner that complies with the aforementioned guidance and with the following operating conditions:

1. The emergency vegetative debris burn site may accept natural vegetative debris generated as a result of the April 27, 2011 tornado event, unless otherwise authorized by the MDEQ.
