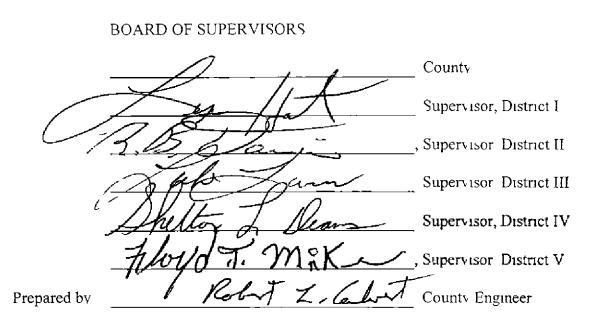

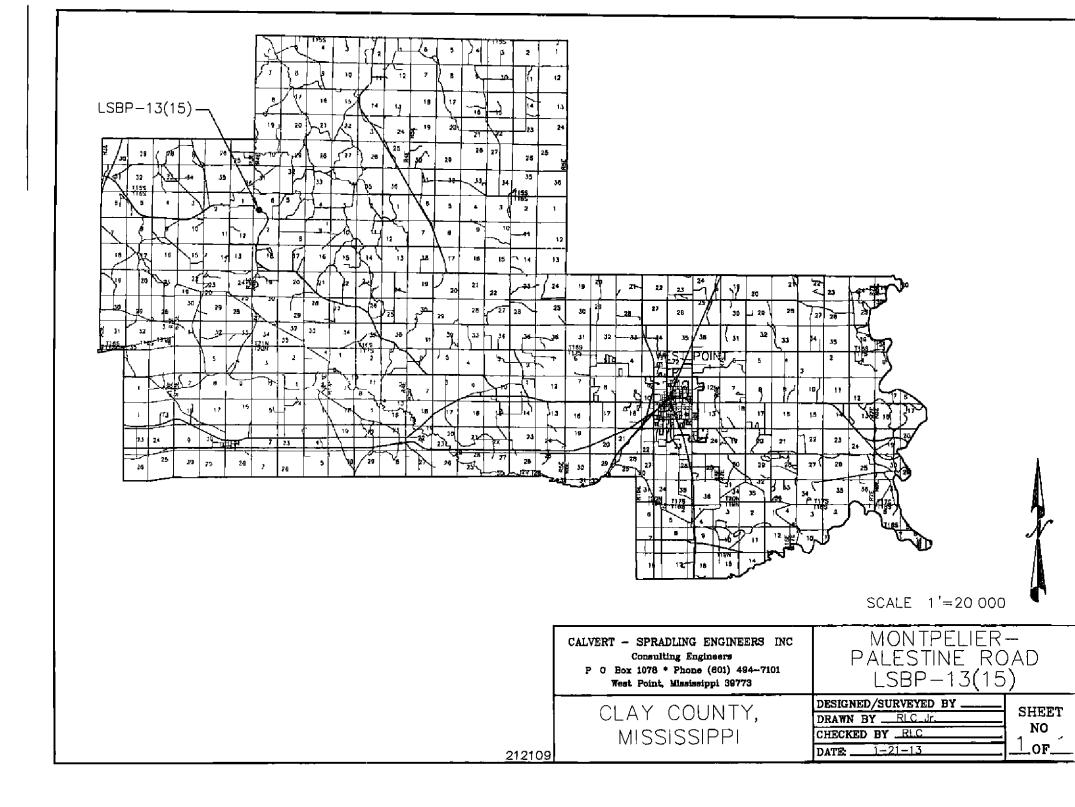

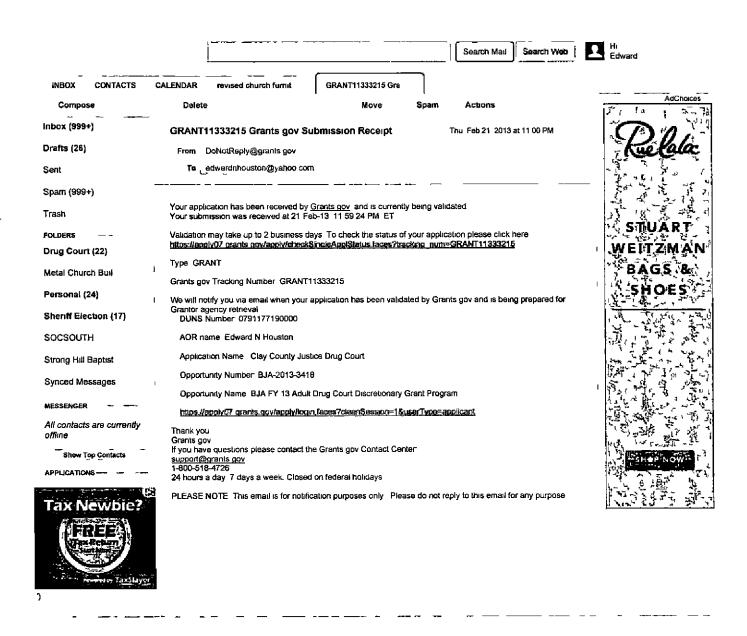

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Clay County, Mississippi (the "Board"), acting for and on behalf of Supervisor District Five of Clay County, Mississippi (the "District"), hereby finds, determines, adjudicates and declares as follows

1 The District is authorized by Sections 19-9-1 through 19-9-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act"), to issue bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued for the purposes and the amounts set forth in paragraph 2 of this preamble

2 It is necessary and in the public interest to issue General Obligation Road and Bridge Bonds, Series 2013 (the "Bonds") of the District in the principal amount of not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) to raise money for the purpose of providing funds for constructing, reconstructing, and repairing roads, highways and bridges, and acquiring the necessary land, including land for road-building materials, acquiring rights-of-way therefore, and the purchase of heavy construction equipment and accessories thereto reasonably required to construct, repair and renovate roads, highways and bridges and approaches thereto within the District (the "Project")

3 The assessed value of all taxable property within the District, according to the last completed assessment for taxation, is Twenty Four Million Seven Hundred Fourteen Thousand Four Hundred Seven Dollars (\$24,714,407), the District has outstanding bonded indebtedness subject to the fifteen percent (15%) debt limit prescribed by Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, in the amount of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000), and outstanding bonded and floating indebtedness subject to the twenty percent (20%) debt limit prescribed by Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (which amount includes the sum set forth above subject to the 15% debt limit), in the amount of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000), the issuance of the Bonds hereinafter proposed to be issued pursuant to the Act, when added to the

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outstanding bonded indebtedness of the District, will not result in bonded indebtedness, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid fifteen percent (15%) debt limit, of more than fifteen percent (15%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the District, and will not result in indebtedness, both bonded and floating, exclusive of indebtedness not subject to the aforesaid twenty percent (20%) debt limit, in excess of twenty percent (20%) of the assessed value of taxable property within the District, and will not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation upon indebtedness which may be incurred by the District

4 The District reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures prior to the issuance of the Bonds, which it intends to reimburse with the proceeds of the Bonds upon the issuance thereof. This declaration of official intent to reimburse expenditures made prior to the issuance of the Bonds in anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds is made pursuant to Department of Treasury Regulations Section 1 150-2 (the reimbursement regulations). The Project for which such expenditures are made is the same as described hereinabove. The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for the Project is the amount hereinabove set forth

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD ACTING FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE DISTRICT, AS FOLLOWS

SECTION 1 The Board hereby declares its intention to issue General Obligation Road and Bridge Bonds, Series 2013, of the District in the principal amount of not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) pursuant to the Act to raise money for the Project The Bonds may be issued in one or more series and will be general obligations of the District payable as to principal and interest out of and secured by an irrevocable pledge of the avails of a direct and continuing tax to be levied annually without limitation as to time, rate, or amount upon all the taxable property within the geographical limits of the District

SECTION 2 The Board proposes to direct the issuance of the Bonds in the amounts, for the purposes and secured as aforesaid at a meeting place of the Board at its meeting place in the Clay County Courthouse in the City of West Point, Mississippi, at the hour of 10 00 o'clock a m on April 4, 2013

SECTION 3 If on or before 10 00 o'clock a m on April 4, 2013, twenty percent (20%) of the qualified electors of the District or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is less, shall file a written protest with the clerk of Clay County against the issuance of the Bonds pursuant to the Act, then Bonds for such purpose or purposes shall not be issued unless authorized at an election on the question of the issuance of such Bonds to be called and held as provided by law If no protest be filed on or before 10 00 o'clock a m on April 4, 2013, against the issuance of Bonds, then the Bonds may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance thereof at any time within a period of two (2) years after the date specified in Section 2 hereof

SECTION 4 This resolution shall be published once a week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in the *Daily Times Leader* a newspaper published in the City of West Point, Mississippi, and having a general circulation in the District and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended The first publication of this resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to the date fixed herein for the issuance of the Bonds, and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date

SECTION 5. The Clerk of the Board shall be and is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of the publication of this resolution and have the same before the Board on the date and hour specified in Section 2 hereof

SECTION 6 The District reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures prior to the issuance of the Bonds, which it intends to reimburse with the proceeds of the Bonds upon the issuance thereof.
