

Dear Board of Supervisors

As you all know, pursuant to state law, the District Attorney for Circuit Court District 16 serves Lowndes, Oktibbeha, Clay and Noxubee counties. For at least the last thirty years, the District Attorney's Office for Circuit Court District 16 has been located at 220 5th Street North, Columbus, MS. Lowndes County owns this building and has allowed the DA's office to use it rent free. Lowndes County has also paid the utility bills for this building without contribution from the other counties in the Circuit. Over the decades, the building has become an occupational hazard. In short, it is likely full of asbestos. Indeed, Lowndes County has plans to tear the building down.

In that regard, the District Attorney's Office needs a new office building. I have searched for a new building for the District Attorney's office for the last few months and, after careful review, have found a potential building to lease. The building is located at 522 2nd Ave North, Columbus, MS and is owned by the estate of Frank Lee. It is a two story building with a total of 10 office spaces. It sufficiently meets the needs of this Circuit's District Attorney's Office. My office and the landlord have reached a tentative agreement of a \$2500 a month lease plus utilities.


Since the District Attorney's office will be entering into a private lease, the other counties in the Circuit need to contribute to the monthly lease and the utility bill. My proposal is for the breakdown to be the same as for the other services split between the counties for this Circuit Court Circuit, as follows:

Lowndes County 42.7%
Oktibbeha County 33.3%
Clay County 15%
Noxubee County 9%

Based on this percentage, Clay County's portion of the monthly lease would be approximately \$375. I am not able to provide the county with a reasonable projection of the county's portion of the utility cost because the building has been unoccupied for a significant period of time. Lowndes County has tentatively agreed to pay the utility cost and bill Clay County its portion of the bill based on the above listed percentage.

In summary, I'm requesting the Clay County board of supervisors agree to pay \$375 a month for the lease of a new District Attorney building for this Circuit along with an agreement to reimburse Lowndes County 33.3% of the monthly utility bill for the office. I appreciate your consideration of this matter. It's an honor to serve as your District Attorney.

INFORMATION FROM THE SASSI INSTITUTE ON CHANGES IN THE SASSI – 4

Below are the changes between the SASSI-3 and the SASSI-4

The SASSI-4 screens for Substance Use Disorder (SUD) along the full DSM-5 continuum of severity mild, moderate, and severe SUD. The SASSI-3 was only validated to screen for Substance Dependence, it was not validated to screen for Substance Abuse Disorders. If Counselors have clients who they think are in the early stages of a SUD or have a mild SUD, the SASSI-4 is validated to screen for that.

The SASSI-4 has excellent specificity in a sample of people diagnosed with other psychological disorders. That is, SASSI-4 does not mistakenly identify individuals experiencing other cognitive, somatic or psychological symptoms with high probability of SUD screening outcomes. In addition, when individuals are experiencing symptoms of both SUD and other psychological disorders (i.e. are dual-diagnosis clients), SASSI-4 SUD screening outcomes are highly accurate for SUD. These findings speak to the construct validity of the SASSI-4 – it can accurately identify the presence and the absence of SUD, even when other psychological symptoms are present.

Additional subtle items were added to the SASSI-4 SAT scale.

A brief new scale, Prescription Drug (Rx), was added to accurately identify individuals likely to be abusing prescription medications.

New SYM, FVA and FVOD items were added to identify symptoms represented in the DSM-5 Diagnostic Criteria.

Revised decision rules improved correspondence with DSM-5 diagnoses.

SASSI-4 can accurately screen for the presence of SUD in two time frames: the client's entire lifetime, as was available on SASSI-3, and now "the past year" is an additional validated time frame that has been added to the SASSI-4.

(Counselors will still have the option of instructing clients to answer the FVA and FVOD items based on 6-month time frames, but we still caution users that evaluations based upon the 6-month time frames may miss identifying some clients who actually do have substance abuse disorders.)





BITUMINOUS DISTRIBUTOR AND CHASSIS

New

GENERAL

It is the intention of these specifications to describe a **Bituminous Distributor** in sufficient detail to secure bids on comparable equipment. The Distributor shall be a current model under standard production by the manufacturer with a capacity for 1900 U S gallons, 12 feet of spraybar, and diesel heat mounted on a 2017 automatic transmission chassis

Any unit not conforming to these specifications will be rejected, and it will be the responsibility of the supplier and manufacturer to conform with the requirements

FUNCTION

The Distributor shall be able to accurately apply all types of Bituminous material as well as be equipped with valves and piping to perform the following functions

- Load tank with pump suction
- Circulate material in tank
- Circulate material in spraybar
- Spray through spraybar and/or handspray gun
- Return material to tank from spraybar or handspray
- Pump material back to supply source
- Clean out pump spraybar, handspray and piping

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
