CALL TO ORDER/INVOCATION

The meeting was called to order by Sheriff Scott. The welcome was given by Supervisor Horton with invocation provided by Supervisor Lummus.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Supervisor Chandler moved to adopt the agenda as prepared. The motion was seconded by Supervisor Davis.

CIRCUIT CLERK'S MONTHLY REPORT

1. <u>CUSTOMER ACCOUNT ESTABLISHMENT:</u>

- A. A separate Vendor Customer Number will be required for each specific customer/installation location.
- B. The Customer is identified as the entity on the first line of the "bill-to" address. All invoices and notices of changes will be sent to the "bill-to" address in accordance with Paragraph 8 herein.
- C. Ship-to and/or Installed-at address is the location to which the initial shipment of equipment/supplies will be made and the address to which service representatives will respond. Subsequent shipments of supplies for installed equipment will also be delivered to the "installed-at" address unless otherwise requested.
- Unless creditworthiness for this Customer Number has been previously established by Vendor, Vendor's Credit Department may conduct a credit investigation for this Agreement. Notwithstanding delivery of equipment, Vendor may revoke this Agreement by written notice to the Customer if credit approval is denied within thirty (30) days after the date this Agreement is accepted for Vendor by an authorized representative.
- 2. <u>EQUIPMENT SELECTION, PRICES, AND AGREEMENT</u>: The Customer has selected and Vendor agrees toprovide t equipment, including applicable software and services to render it continually operational, identified on Exhibit A attached to this Agreement. The specific prices, inclusive of applicable transportation charges, are as set forth on the attached Exhibit A. The parties understand and agree that the Customer is exempt from the payment of taxes.
- 3. SHIPPING AND TRANSPORTATION: Vendor agrees to pay all non-priority, ground shipping, transportation, rigging and drayage charges for the equipment from the equipment's place of manufacture to the installation addresof the equipment as specified under this Agreement. If any form of express shipping method is requested, it will be paid for by Customer.
- 4.

 RISK OF LOSS OR DAMAGE TO EQUIPMENT: While in transit, Vendor shall assume and bear the entire risk of loss and damage to the equipment from any cause whatsoever. If, during the period the equipment is in Customer's possession, due to gross negligence of the customer, the equipment is lost or damaged, then, the customer shall bear the cost of replacing or repairing said equipment.

5. DELIVERY, INSTALLATION, ACCEPTANCE, AND RELOCATION:

- A. <u>DELIVERY</u>: Vendor shall deliver the equipment to the location specified by Customer and pursuant to the delivery schedule agreed upon by the parties. If, through no fault of the Customer, Vendor is unable to deliver the equipment or software, the prices, terms and conditions will remain unchanged until delivery is made by Vendor. If, however, Vendor does not deliver the equipment or software within ten (10) working days of the delivery due date, Customer shall have the right to terminate the order without penalty, cost or expense to Customer of any kind whatsoever.
- B. <u>INSTALLATION SITE</u>: At the time of delivery and during the period Vendor is responsible for maintenance of the equipment, the equipment installation site must conform to Vendor's published space, electrical and environmental requirements; and the Customer agrees to provide, at no charge, reasonable access to the

equipment and to a telephone for local or toll free calls.

C. <u>INSTALLATION DATE</u>: The installation date of the equipment shall be that date as is agreed upon by the parties, if Vendor is responsible for installing the equipment.

- D. <u>ACCEPTANCE</u>: Unless otherwise agreed to by the parties, Vendor agrees that Customer shall have ten (10) working days from date of delivery and installation, to inspect, evaluate and test the equipment to confirm that it is in good working order.
- E. RELOCATION: Customer may transfer equipment to a new location by notifying Vendor in writing of the transfer at least thirty (30) calendar days before the move is made. If Vendor is responsible for maintenance of the equipment, this notice will enable Vendor to provide technical assistance in the relocation efforts, if needed, as well as to update Vendor's records as to machine location. There will be no cessation of rental charges during the period of any such transfer. The Vendor's cost of moving and reinstalling equipment from one location to another is not included in this Agreement, and Customer agrees to pay Vendor, after receipt of invoice of Vendor's charges with respect to such moving of equipment, which will be billed to Customer in accordance with Vendor's standard practice then in effect for commercial users of similar equipment or software and payment remitted in accordance with Paragraph 8 herein.
- 6. <u>RENTAL TERM</u>: The rental term for each item of equipment shall be that as stated in the attached Exhibit A. If the Customer desires to continue renting the equipment at the expiration of the original rental agreement, the Customer mu enter into a new rental agreement which shall be separate from this Agreement. There will be no automatic renewals allowed. There shall be no option to purchase.
- OWNERSHIP: Unless the Customer has obtained title to the equipment, title to the equipment shall be and remain vested at all times in Vendor or its assignee and nothing in this Agreement shall give or convey to Customer any right, title or interest therein, unless purchased by Customer. Nameplates, stencils or other indicia of Vendor's ownership affixed or to be affixed to the equipment shall not be removed or obliterated by Customer.

8. <u>PAYMENTS</u>:

- A. <u>INVOICING AND PAYMENTS</u>: The charges for the equipment, software or services covered by this Agreement are specified in the attached Exhibit A. Charges for any partial month for any item of equipment shall be prorated based on a thirty (30) day month. Vendor shall submit an invoice with the appropriate documentation to Customer.
 - 1. <u>E-PAYMENT:</u> The Vendor agrees to accept all payments in United States currency via the State of Mississippi's electronic payment and remittance vehicle. The Customer agrees to make payment in accordan with Mississippi law on "Timely Payments for Purchases by Public Bodies", Section 31-7-301, et seq. of the 1972 Mississippi Code Annotated, as amended, which generally provides for payment of undisputed amounts by the agency within forty-five (45) days of receipt of the invoice.
 - 2. <u>PAYMODE:</u> Payments by state agencies using Mississippi's Accountability System for Government Information and Collaboration (MAGIC) shall be made and remittance information provided electronically a directed by the State. The State, may at its sole discretion, require the Vendor to submit invoices and supporting documentation electronically at any time during the term of this Agreement. These payments shall be deposited into the bank account of the Vendor's choice. The Vendor understands and agrees that the State is exempt from the payment of taxes. All payments shall be in United States currency.
- B. METER READINGS: If applicable, the Customer shall provide accurate and timely meter readings at the enc of each applicable billing period on the forms or other alternative means specified by Vendor. Vendor shall he the right, upon reasonable prior notice to Customer, and during Customer's regular business hours, to inspect the equipment and to monitor the meter readings. If Customer meter readings are not received in the time to be agreed upon by the parties, the meter readings may be obtained electronically or by other means or may be estimated by Vendor subject to reconciliation when the correct meter reading is received by Vendor.

 C.
- <u>COPY CREDITS</u>: If applicable, if a copier is being rented, the Customer will receive one (1) copy credit for each copy presented to Vendor which, in the Customer's opinion, is unusable and also for each copy which

was produced during servicing of the equipment. Copy credits will be issued only if Vendor is responsible for providing equipment services or maintenance services (except time and materials maintenance). Copy credits will be reflected on the invoice as a reduction in the total copy volume, except for run length plans which will be credited at a specific copy credit rate as shown on the applicable price list.

9. <u>USE OF EQUIPMENT</u>: Customer shall operate the equipment according to the manufacturer's specifications and documented instructions. Customer agrees not to employ or use additional attachments, features or devices on the equipment or make changes or alterations to the equipment covered hereby without the prior written consent of Vendor in each case, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

10. MAINTENANCE SERVICES, EXCLUSIONS, AND REMEDIES:

- A. SERVICES: If Vendor is responsible for providing equipment services, maintenance services (except for and materials), or warranty services: (1) Vendor shall install and maintain the equipment and make a necessary adjustments and repairs to keep the equipment in good working order. (2) Parts required for repair may be used or reprocessed in accordance with Vendor's specifications and replaced parts are the property of Vendor, unless otherwise specifically provided on the price lists. (3) Services will be provided during Customer's usual business hours. (4) If applicable, Customer will permit Vendor to install, at no cost to Customer, all retrofits designated by Vendor as mandatory or which are designed to insure accuracy of meters.
- B. EXCLUSIONS: The following is not within the scope of services: (1) Provision and installation of optional retrofits. (2) Services connected with equipment relocation. (3) Installation/removal of accessories, attachments or other devices. (4) Exterior painting or refinishing of equipment. (5) Maintenance, installation or removal of equipment or devices not provided by Vendor. (6) Performance of normal operator functions as described in applicable Vendor operator manuals. (7) Performance of services necessitated by accident; power failure; unauthorized alteration of equipment or software; tampering; service by someone other than Vendor; causes other than ordinary use; interconnection of equipment by electrical, or electronic or mechanical means with noncompatible equipment, or failure to use operating system software. If Vendor provides, at the request of the Customer, any of the services noted above, the Customer may be billed by Vendor at a rate not to exceed the Master State Prices Agreement between the Vendor and the State of Mississippi, or in the absence of such agreement at the then current time and materials rates.
- C. <u>REMEDIES</u>: If during the period in which Vendor is providing maintenance services, Vendor is unable to maintain the equipmentin good workingorder, Vendorwill, at no additional charge, provide either an identical replacement or another product that provides equal or greater capabilities.
- HOLD HARMLESS: To the fullest extent allowed by law, Vendor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmles protect, and exonerate the Customer and the State of Mississippi, its Commissioners, Board Members, officer employees, agents, and representatives from and against all claims, demands, liabilities, suits, actions, damages, losses, and costs of every kind and nature whatsoever, including, without limitation, court costs, investigative fees and expenses, and attorneys' fees, arising out of or caused by Vendor and/or its partners, principals, agents, employees, and/or subcontractors in the performance of or failure to perform this Agreement. In the Customer's sole discretion, Vendor may be allowed to control the defense of any such claim, suit, etc. In the event Vendor defends said claim, suit, etc., Vendor shall use legal counsel acceptable to the Customer; Vendor shall be solely liable for all reasonable costs and/or expenses associated with such defense and the Customer shall be entitled to participate in said defense. Vendor shall not settle any claim, suit, etc., without the Customer's concurrence, which the Customer shall not unreasonably withhold.

12. ALTERATIONS, ATTACHMENTS, AND SUPPLIES:

A. RESOLUTION OF THE CLAY COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS DECLARING SURPLUS PROPERTY AND AUTHORIZING DEED OF CONVEYANCE TO UPPER PRAIRIE CREEK MISSIONARY BAPTIST CHURCH

THERE CAME ON TO BE HEARD AND WAS HEARD the motion of Supervisor Chandler, which was duly seconded by Supervisor Deanes, to adopt the following resolution, to-wit:

RE: DECLARATION OF SURPLUS PROPERTY

WHEREAS, Section 19-7-3(4), *Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended*, authorizes the Clay County Board of Supervisors to dispose of real property under certain conditions, with said section expressly stating as follows:

Whenever the board of supervisors shall find and determine, by resolution duly and lawfully adopted and spread upon its minutes (a) that any county-owned property is no longer needed for county or related purposes and is not to be used in the operation of the county, (b) that the sale of the property in the manner otherwise provided by law is not necessary or desirable for the financial welfare of the county, and (c) that the use of the county property for the purpose for which it is to be sold, conveyed or leased will promote and foster the development and improvement of the community in which it is located and the civic, social, educational, cultural, moral, economic or industrial welfare thereof, the board of supervisors of such county shall be authorized and empowered, in its discretion, to sell, convey, lease, or otherwise dispose of same for any of the purposes set forth herein.

WHEREAS, Warranty Deed executed on or about April 26, 1920, was recorded in the Office of the Clay County Chancery Clerk conveying a one acre tract of land to Clay County to be used as the Upper Prairie Creek School House. A review of the documents and records on file in the Clay County Tax Assessors's Office, the Clay County Chancery Clerk's Office and the Office of the Superintendent of Schools for the West Point Consolidated School District do not reflect the property being reported, indexed or otherwise inventoried as property owned by Clay County, the West Point Consolidated School District, or any of the school district's predecessors in interest.

WHEREAS, a review of the records in the aforementioned offices further reveal the property has been documented as being owned by Upper Prairie Creek Missionary Baptist Church, with no ad valorem taxes having been collected for many years.

WHEREAS the Clay County Board of Supervisors finds the subject tract of land meets the statutory requirements to be conveyed according to Section 19-7-3(4) of *Mississippi Code of 1972*, as amended.

IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED AND RESOLVED that the Attorney for the Clay County Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to prepare, and the Board President authorized to execute, a Warranty Deed conveying the property described in Warranty Deed filed at Deed Book 48, Page 351, the same having been filed for record on or about April 26, 1920, in the Office of the Chancery Clerk of Clay County, to Upper Prairie Creek Missionary Baptist Church.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND RESOLVED that the Clay County Board of Supervisors did make the following findings:

- 1) that the subject property is not being used for, nor is it needed for County operations or any County related purpose;
- 2) that the sale of the subject property, in the manner provided by law, is not necessary or desirable for the financial welfare of the County; and
- 3) that the use of the subject property for the use and benefit of Upper Prairie Creek Missionary Baptist Church will promote and foster the development and improvement of the community in which the church is located, as well as the civic, social, educational, cultural and moral welfare thereof.

After due discussion, the motion was called for a vote with each supervisor responding as follows, to-wit:
